

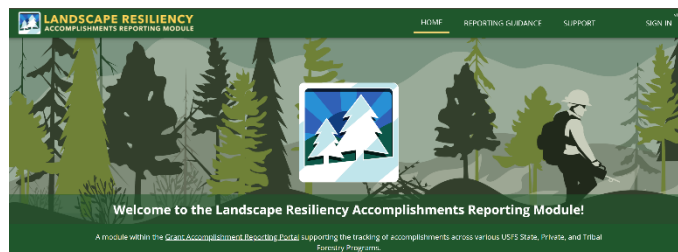


Coming June 2025!

Landscape Resiliency Accomplishments Reporting Module

Overview

Starting in June, the Landscape Resiliency Accomplishments Reporting Module (Landscape ARM) will be **the new accomplishments reporting platform for USFS Cooperative Fire grant-funded investments in hazardous fuels treatments**. It will be one of four modules in GARP and will help track work that supports the goal of Resilient Landscapes set forth in the [National Cohesive Wildland Fire Management Strategy](#).

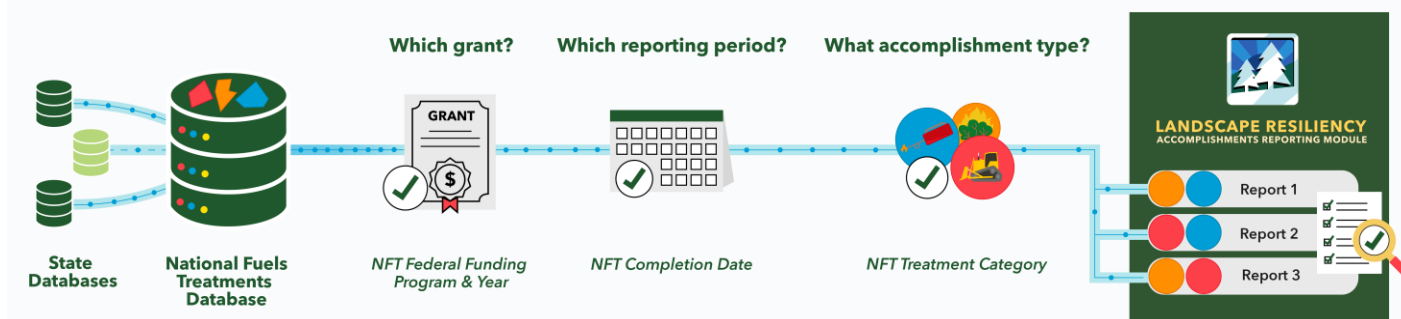


Completed treatment accomplishment details will be tracked for the following US Forest Service (USFS) Funding Programs:

- State Fire Capacity – Core
- IIJA State Fire Assistance
- Joint Chiefs Landscape Restoration Grants
- NEMW Wildfire Risk Reduction Grants
- Southern Mitigation Grants
- Western Wildland Urban Interface Grants

Landscape ARM integration with National Fuels Treatments (NFT)

State Forestry organizations that are [sharing data with the NFT](#) database have the opportunity to mark up their mapped treatments with key details that will enable the Landscape ARM to automatically aggregate completed treatment acres (and optionally, costs). This will streamline reporting and enable NASF and USFS to more meaningfully convey the impact of these programs. Contact support@garphub.org for more details.



Get DATA READY for the Landscape ARM

Because your data is key to quantifying the impact of these programs, NASF, USFS, and the GARP Team want you to be prepared for the June release of Landscape ARM. If you manage grant-supported hazardous fuels treatments for your organization, please watch the **short 10-minute Landscape ARM Data Preparation Video** to get oriented about general GARP reporting requirements as well as specific data needed for Landscape ARM. Who will use Landscape ARM?

Starting in June, **staff from State Forestry organizations** whose responsibility it is to report on hazardous fuels treatment accomplishments will be invited to request a GARP account with the “**Grant Manager**” role. Other authorized State and USFS staff can explore and view the details entered. *(People with existing GARP accounts will be automatically given the appropriate Landscape ARM role in June without a request needed, if they are on the list of authorized users provided to the GARP Team.)*
