


The Big Picture

The Cross Program Accomplishment Reporting Module, also called the Cross Program ARM, is for aggregation of accomplishments across the State and Volunteer Fire Program grants and is where you will:

- · View your State and Volunteer Fire grants and planned accomplishments, set up by USFS Regional Office staff
- Complete Performance Reports describing actual accomplishments for each grant and reporting period
- Review accomplishments automatically imported from the other GARP modules
- Generate Performance Progress Report (PPR) documentation per Federal Award, as required by USFS

Before you begin, it is important to understand that the three outer ARMs are tailored to track distinct program accomplishments by theme, and details reported in these modules and then are automatically fed into the grant Performance Reports in the Cross Program ARM.









Cross Program ARM Benefits

• The Cross Program ARM is the hub for aggregation of all State Fire and Volunteer Fire Program accomplishments into a national dataset so that NASF and the USDA Forest Service (USFS) can demonstrate the impact and value of the investments in these programs to Congress and the White House.

Performance Reporting

• GARP automatically pulls accomplishments reported in the other modules into Performance Reports in the Cross Program ARM, as appropriate for the grant, and the Grant Managers in the Cross Program module will report remaining miscellaneous details not covered in the other modules.

Reporting Periods

• Reporting periods describe the period within which work was accomplished. All reporting periods are based on CALENDAR years and quarters, not federal or state fiscal years.

State vs. Volunteer Fire Grants

• Performance Reports for Volunteer Fire Program grants will reflect accomplishments-to-date, whereas State Fire Program grants will describe accomplishments within a specified reporting period. Landscape ARM and Community ARM Accomplishment Reports must be marked as Complete (or Not Started) for the associated Performance Report that is marked as Complete in the Cross Program ARM for a State Fire Program grant.

PPRs

• Progress Performance Reports (PPRs) synthesize all accomplishments in a reporting period by Federal Award. They should be downloaded for use in your documentation and submitted to USFS, following the deadlines specified by each and report type.









GARP Account




Viewing List of Grants

- 1. Please see the next section for viewing the performance reporting status of your grants. However, the quickest way to get to a grant you want to work with is to find it on the Grants page. Select "Grants" from the header. The Grants grid shows a list of all State Fire and Volunteer Fire Program grants entered by your USFS Region for your organization
- You can see the grant identifier details, including Funding Year, Funding Program, Organization, and Award ID
- If the grant is FY 2024 or later, you will see the "Planned Accomplishment Status" and the associated total "Planned Funding", as entered by the USFS Regions on your behalf

Note: Older grants that predate GARP will not have planned details.

4. Select "View" from the Actions column to go to the Grant Profile. The Grant Profile is discussed here












To begin working with Performance Reports, you will visit the Performance Reporting page to review the current status of reporting for each grant.

- 1. Select the "Reporting" from the header, and you will land on the Performance Reporting page
- 2. Hover on the **i icon** to see the additional information that this selection governs which calendar year of reports you will see in the list. The selection will default to today's Reporting Year, but you can select previous year Performance Reports by selecting it from the list
- 3. The "Reporting Year" pick list filters your list of Performance Reports, so you only view one year's worth of reports at a time










- 4. The "Grant Performance Reporting" grid contains all your active grants and their reporting status(es)
- 5. The "**Reporting Period**" column indicates the period covered in the Performance Report for the grant in that row. Annually reported performance reports will show a calendar year, whereas quarterly reported grants will show each of the four calendar quarters within the selected Reporting Year
- 6. The "Performance Report" column indicates the status of the report in the Cross Program ARM for the Reporting Period and grant in that row. Statuses include "Not Started", "Draft", and "Complete"










Viewing Performance Reporting Statuses (Continued)

- 7. The "Funding Year", "Funding Program", and "Organization" together indicate the grant that the report is for, and the "Award ID" indicates which Federal Award the grant was executed through
- For State Fire Program grants only, the "Landscape ARM Status" and "Community ARM Status" columns show statuses of the associated accomplishment reports in those other modules. Statuses include "Not Started", "Draft", and "Complete"

Note: If there are no accomplishments to report in those modules for the reporting period, then you may still complete the Performance Report with these reports in the "Not Started" status.

9. Select "View" from the "Action" column to open the Grant's Profile page










Viewing Planned Accomplishments


When you've selected a grant from the Reporting page, you will land on its Grant profile page and see the following:

- 1. The grant's identifying information, and its Federal Award ID will display in the top left
- 2. By default, the "**Planned Accomplishments**" page is selected. For FY 2024 and later, your planned accomplishments will be entered by the USFS Region. All earlier grants predate GARP, so they will not have planned accomplishment values
- 3. If it is a State Fire Program grant, you will see a "Summary" section, a "Cross Functional Investments" section and a "Community Mitigation and Hazardous Fuels" section (last section not shown below)
- 4. If it is a Volunteer Fire Program grant, you will see a "Summary" section, a "Program Demand" section, and a "Program Investments" section

Adding Performance Reports for SF Program Grants

1. Select the "+Add Performance Report" from the Actions section to start a new report for the State Fire (SF) Program grant

- 2. A "New Performance Report" window will display, where you must make selections to create the new report
- 3. From the "Select Reporting Period", select the reporting period

Note: This pick list will have a list of **calendar years** to choose from for annually reported grants and **calendar quarters** for quarterly reported grants.

- 4. From the "Select Report Type", select either "Interim" if this is not the last report for the grant, or "Final" if no further accomplishment reports will be submitted to the USFS


Viewing Performance Reports for SF Program Grants

For a refresher on how to access a grant, review the guidance here. When you complete a report, you will automatically be taken to the Grant Profile page.

- 1. From the "Reports" section of the Grant Profile page, select the report to view. Reports are identified by their Reporting Period and Status.
- 2. The "Summary" section displays at the top. State Fire Program grants include 3 aggregated details: "Total Reporting Period Costs", number of "Treatment Acres Directly Funded", and the number of "Total Unique Communities Assisted"

Note: The number of "Total Unique Communities Assisted" is the total unique number of communities assisted by the grant in the reporting period.

3. The "Performance Report Details" are organized into three categories, with the "Hazardous Fuels Treatments" category selected by default




